How can I join this Program?

How long can I stay in this Program?

As long as you continue to meet the BCC Program eligibility guidelines, you can get a well-woman exam at **no cost** every year!

What if I need treatment?

If you are diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer while enrolled in the BCC Program, you may be eligible for Breast and Cervical Cancer Medicaid or other resources for support.

Well-woman exams at **no cost** every year for women who are eligible for the Program.

What is a well-woman exam?

A well-woman exam is a yearly checkup that includes screening for breast and cervical cancer. When breast cancer is found early, the chance of surviving for at least five years is 98%. When cervical cancer is found early, the chance of surviving for at least five years is 92%.

That is why it is so important to get your well-woman exam EVERY YEAR!



Who can get a well-woman exam?

Women who...

Are age 30 or older

Have little or no health insurance

Have a low income
